Description:

This course will help chief officers develop and manage response areas or neighborhood-based risk reduction programs based on a systematic analysis of their target audience and a profile of their communities. Topics will include the role of the chief officer in neighborhood-based risk reduction, developing community equity, assessing community risk, and developing a strategy to implement a community risk plan.

Course Goal:

The goal of this course is to prepare the newly promoted chief officers to manage risk reduction responsibilities at their organizational level in concert with the overall risk reduction mission of the department.

Course Objective:

Upon completing this course, the chief officers will be able to develop and manage a response-area or neighborhood-based risk reduction program based on a systematic analysis of the target audience and the profile of the community.
