Description:

This course builds on the NIMS: Advanced Incident Command System (ICS) course. The focus will be on the roles and responsibilities of section chief at major incidents. Each ICS section (i.e., incident commander, planning section chief, operations section chief, logistics section chief, and finance/administration section chief) will be discussed in detail. This course includes an intense activity designed to expand the ICS to its full potential.



Scope of Training:

This course shall prepare students to meet requirements set forth by the Homeland Security Presidential Directive 5 and to be able to operate and/or manage within an expanded ICS system referenced by the National Wildfire Coordinating Group, I-300 and I-400 course.

Course Objectives:

Upon completion of this course, the students will be able to:

1. Define the roles and responsibilities of Incident Management Teams
2. Define the roles and responsibilities of the Incident Commander and Section Chiefs for Operations, Planning, Logistics and Finance/Administration
3. Demonstrate the expansion of ICS
4. Utilize ICS forms for large scale incidents
5. Collect, analyze and utilize incident information; develop an incident action plan; develop incident demobilization plans
6. Assess incident situation, conduct initial briefing, plan meetings, define the process for transfer of command.

This course is approved by the United States Fire Administration's National Fire Academy.
